Langley recently had the opportunity to present on the PMI Pulse of the Profession research at a premier event for the U.S. National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA).
The event, which took place at the Goddard Space Flight Center, Greenbelt, Maryland, USA, was broadcast live over NASA TV and video recorded for future distribution.

Mr. Langley detailed the findings of PMI's *Pulse of the Profession* research, discussing areas such as talent development, benefits realization and organizational agility. The talk was

significant in that it positioned PMI as the thought leader in the project management arena and strengthened relationships with an agency that employs about 100 Project Management Professional (PMP)® credential holders.
