stanbul, the storied Turkish city where East meets West, proved an apt setting to discuss today's massive cultural and business shifts-and what they signify for the profession. More than 850 project professionals from 68 countries gathered at PMI<sup>®</sup> Global Congress 2013—EMEA to learn about everything from cross-cultural collaboration to leadership skills.

### Awards Dinner Caps Hurricane Fundraising Efforts

ew Yorkers are known for having a strong community of volunteers, especially in times when it is needed the most. 2012 brought much hardship to the New York City area from Hurricane Sandy, including loss of life, families displaced due to loss of their homes, and people looking for shelter, food and heat. The PMI New York City Chapter (PMINYC) community stepped in to see if there was any way it could assist.

After chapter officers conferred with government officials on where to donate money, 2012 Chapter President Joshua Lerner, PMP, immediately had a communication sent to members and vendors notifying them that they could donate to The Stephen Siller Tunnel to Towers Foundation specifically for relief on hard-hit Staten Island, and The American Red Cross. PMINYC as an organization donated to these two funds. The chapter also listed various drop-off points where individuals could donate relief and clean-up supplies.

A few weeks after the storm, the chapter combined its ExCEL (Excellence in Creativity, Education and Leadership) Awards with a fundraising dinner for

hurricane victims. The chapter raised over US\$8,000 for the relief effort from its communications to members and vendors and from donations at the dinner.

Recipients of awards given out at the event included those for the 2012 PMI-NYC ExCEL Strategic Partnership of the Year Award: the International Institute of Learning, World Federation of the United Nations Association and RAND in association with the George W. Bush First Ladies Initiative.

The awards night was capped with a presentation from past presidents who helped lead the organization throughout the years.
